Armed with a COW 37mm gun, pointed at a 45 degree angle up, to attack bombers from under. Weird concept with engine mounted behind the pilot, in the middle of the aircraft, with a pusher prop. First flew in Jan 1931, but none ever produced. Winners: Mike W. and Dennis C.


